EVENING CONCERT AUDIENCE PROTOCOL

In keeping in line with safety protocols, each family has received **two tickets only** for the evening performance. They have been sent home today with your eldest child. Younger siblings (four years old and under) must sit on adult laps as chairs are reserved for adults.

Please inform extended family members about seating restrictions and invite them to attend the matinee performances. Only those with tickets will be allowed admittance to the Gymnasium for the evening performance.

After grade performances, students will wait for parents in their classrooms and will be supervised by school staff. Once picked up students cannot be taken into the gymnasium.

Greetings to all the parents of the Corpus Christi Parish School Community.

This Sunday is Gaudete Sunday (Joy Sunday). The Entrance Antiphon states: "Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say, rejoice. Indeed, the Lord is near." (Phil 4:4-5) So, what happens on this Sunday? On this one Sunday of Advent, we are allowed to have flowers in the sanctuary and the priest can wear rose colored vestments – both of these symbolize and convey the joy that we should have as children of God and members of the Church. Why? Because, as St Paul goes on to say, the Lord is near! The birth of Jesus is very soon!

ABOUT ADVENT

Advent is a time of observing the coming Christmas holiday, Jesus' Birth, and is celebrated by Catholics and Orthodox Christians throughout the world. The observance of Advent has its roots in ancient times. Advent means "coming," referring to the coming of Christ. The season of Advent is four weeks before Christmas. Advent calendars are commonly used as a "countdown" to Christmas. Small toys or candies are placed inside little doors or windows, and one door is opened each day to count the days till Christmas. The advent wreath counts down the weeks left until Christmas, starting with the 4th Sunday before Christmas.



An advent wreath contains 4 candles, 3 purple, and 1 pink. Purple signifies penitence and fasting in preparation for the coming of a King. The pink candle is for the 3rd Sunday (also known as the Sunday of Joy). A candle is lit on the advent wreath during the Sunday evening meal. This candle will be lit every evening during the evening meal in many cases. Each week an additional candle is lit, until the last Sunday before Christmas, when all four candles burn. A portion of the Christmas story may be told each week and a devotional completed as part of the observance.

TRAFFIC/PARKING LOT SAFETY

Regulations in the parking lot are in place to ensure the safety of the children. It is essential that parents follow the instructions of staff and yard supervisors on duty. Parents are expected to follow instructions respectfully and comply.

Be aware of residents parked on Nanaimo Street who need to merge. Please stop and allow them access to Nanaimo Street.

MORNING AND AFTERSCHOOL TRAFFIC AND PARKING LOT DUTY PROTOCOLS

Upon arrival check in with other supervisors to ensure that there is one parent at each crosswalk, Nanaimo St. and Waverley Ave. When at all possible two parents should stand at the crosswalks. There should also be a parent at the mid-point slowing down traffic and watching for pedestrians. If the

Parents must not use this time to socialize. Morning and afterschool supervision is one of our most important participation responsibilities as it impacts the safety of children. Parents are asked to supervise carefully, free of distractions.

Cancellation: Remember that cancelling your spot should be done 48 hours before your supervision (2 days in advance) and that it is the parent's responsibility to find a replacement.

It has come to our attention that "no shows" are signing in. If you did not supervise or complete your hours, do not sign in. There will be a \$25 no show penalty.

- Maintains safety.
- Encourages positive atmosphere.
- Anticipates potential dangers and initiates preventive action by informing teacher supervisor
- Any debris or damaged equipment must be reported to supervising teacher
- Report serious injuries as they will be attended by the supervising teacher
- Assists supervising teacher in applying school rules and ensures the teacher is informed when school rules have been violated.
- Exercises a certain amount of understanding, good judgement, good example, impartiality, an absence of discrimination.
- Ensures that students remain within the limits of the designated areas.
- Remain always with the students to be supervised.
- Supervisors must ensure they circulate in the school yard within their assigned zones. Or follow the directions of the supervising teacher
- Supervisors are not permitted to eat or smoke while supervising students, or use Cellphones, take photos or videos
- Supervisors' children cannot accompany parents during supervision
- Supervisors must be on time, sign in and wears Safety vest
